



**RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT
OF AMENDMENTS TO THE
JORDAN LAKE NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT STRATEGY**

In the 2009 Regular Session of the North Carolina General Assembly, Session Laws 2009-216 and 2009-484 addressed the needs to reduce nutrient load to the Jordan Lake watershed in order to remove it from the 303(d) (impaired) list. These Laws are collectively known as the Jordan Lake Nutrient Management Strategy ("Jordan Lake Rules") and contain thirteen elements that require reductions in nutrient loadings to the Jordan Lake watershed, as determined by the NC DENR.

WHEREAS, the Town of Summerfield is a regulated community under the jurisdiction of the aforementioned session laws collectively known as the Jordan Lake Rules; and

WHEREAS, the Stream Buffer Rule (SL 2009-484 PART II, SECTION 6.(f) & 6.(g)) is unsatisfactory in its practice and administration to the Town of Summerfield; and

WHEREAS, the Existing Development Rule (SL 2009-216 SECTION 3.(d) & 3.(e)) is unsatisfactory in its practice and administration to the Town of Summerfield; and

WHEREAS, the Scientific Advisory Board Rule (SL 2009-216 SECTION 4.(a), 4.(b), & 4.(c)) is unsatisfactory in its practice and administration to the Town of Summerfield; and

WHEREAS, the New Development Rule (SL 2009-484 SECTION 5.(c) & 5.(d)) is unsatisfactory in its practice and administration to the Town of Summerfield; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Elected Council of Town of Summerfield resolves to support amendments to the Jordan Lake Rules that will address the aforementioned concerns to improve the efficiency and efficacy of their application.
